

Never meet anyone you only know in the online world. Just because they say they are a child or teenager, it doesn't mean they are.


Don't be afraid to report someone who upsets you online. See www.ceop.police.uk for more advice.

- · Only go to Internet sites that you know are safe.
- Be careful what you type into a search engine.
- Never tell anyone your name, address or telephone number over the Internet.
- · Always tell your parents or teacher if you are upset by something you see on the Internet.

### The Green Cross Code

- 1 First find the safest place to cross.
- 2 Stop just before you get to the kerb.
- 3 Look all around for traffic and listen.
- 4 If traffic is coming, let it pass.
- 5 When it is safe, go straight across the road do not run.
- 6. Arrive safely.
